Dress Code

Employees are expected to have a neat, clean and professional appearance while at work and participating in work related activities.

- Appropriate dress is generally considered business casual
- Jeans are allowed on Fridays, unless a Board/Pillar meeting is taking place (Jeans must have no rips, no holes, and no sagging).
- Clothing for the beach, yard work, dance clubs, evening events, and exercise (leggings) are not appropriate for the workplace
- Dresses and skirts must be knee length or longer
- Excessively revealing clothing that shows too much skin or undergarments is not appropriate
- Torn, dirty, wrinkled or frayed clothing is unacceptable
- Shoes must be worn in the building at all times.

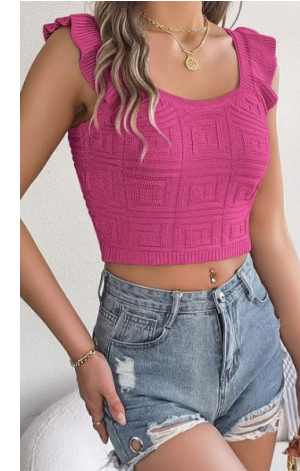
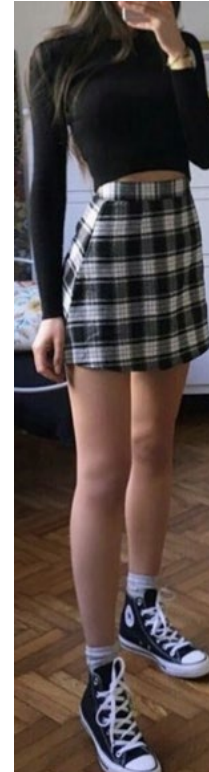
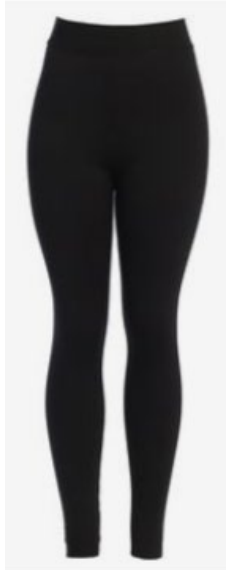
